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WHAT IS MOODLE?

- ✓ A learning platform that enables you to create courses, activities and communities online and make learning fun for your students or members/participants of your youth projects.
- ✓ An open source software with no license costs – free to download and free to use
- ✓ Install it on a server and access it by using your web browser, such as Internet Explorer, Firefox or Safari. You can do this yourself or ask a Moodle partner to help you

WHAT CAN YOU DO WITH MOODLE?

- ✓ Create and manage web based content for courses.
- ✓ Add online elements, such as documents, audio, video and website links as a supplement to traditional courses.
- ✓ Facilitate and deliver online courses and communicate in a direct and indirect way.
- ✓ Upload quizzes and gradable assignments.
- ✓ Continue a classroom discussion online and chat with your students.
- ✓ Help students collaborate online and engage them in discussion forums.

WHAT ARE THE ADVANTAGES?

- ✓ No programming experience necessary.
- ✓ Provides different methods of learning.
- ✓ Decreases paperwork (green solution).
- ✓ Simple to manage your material – you can save all of your course information on the Moodle platform and have easy access whenever you want.

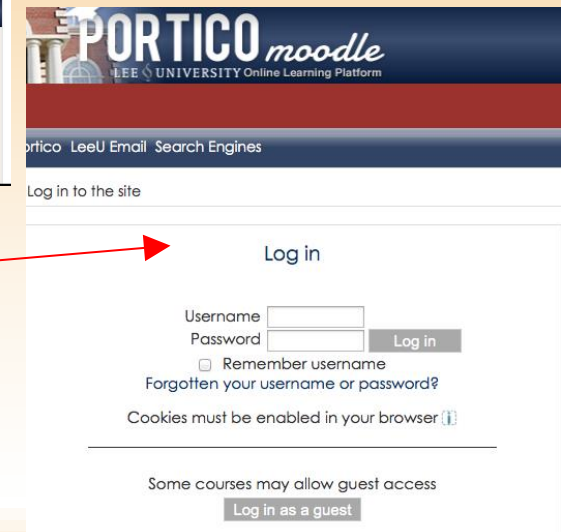
HOW DO YOU GET STARTED?

- ✓ Ask if your school or organization has their own website on the Moodle platform and get the information you need

- ✓ Go to the platform



- ✓ Log in with your personal username and password



HOW DO YOU USE MOODLE?

- ✓ Log in using the password and ID that your school or organization has provided and start using Moodle!

CREATE YOUR OWN PLATFORM


✓ If your school or organization does not have a Moodle platform you can create your own.

How to install Moodle manually?

Pre-installation Steps

If you want to install Moodle manually you have to make some preparations before proceeding.

Step 1: First, you need to download the latest stable Moodle installation package from:
<http://download.moodle.org/>

Step 2: Then, please upload the package under your `public_html` directory, which is the main one for the web site content. If you decide to use the script in a subdirectory of the main one, place it there.
You can upload the Moodle package either through [cPanel](#) -> [File Manager](#) or using an [FTP client](#).
