



## **Training Course “Diversity Around Us”**

### **Project information**

Immigration has been increasing in globalising world since the European Union was founded. However, people have been immigrating for years. It is impossible to say that cultures and ethnicities are indiscrete, while looking at historical array of immigrations.

Since the array of the immigration changed, people have felt and believed themselves belonging to only one culture and when they enter in other cultures, they realize that their culture has already interacted with other cultures. Cultural diversity become in this way something that enables people to treat against other cultures respectfully and to accept diversities. This situation goes out of tolerance concept, but it provides opportunity for individuals, who are proud of that diversity, not for them who are ashamed of the diversity.

Main objectives of the TC project are;

- to gain knowledge and skills about intercultural dialogue, cultural diversity and discrimination;
- to provide visibility of individuals, who are discriminated because of the cultural differences;
- to take the initiative for the projects, which will be improved about discrimination, intercultural dialogue and cultural diversity and also to make youth workers gain knowledge and skills in this field;
- to enable situation between integration and culture being understood and to raise awareness in this field;
- to ensure the participants how to write and improve projects by informing them about Erasmus+. With that project intercultural dialogue, cultural diversity, discrimination and minority rights will be handled, at the same time Erasmus+ Meeting will be held.

We believe that the participants will advance their knowledge and skills about cultural diversity, discrimination and minority rights and then when they go back to their countries, they will influence the society by sharing these information with their organisations. The youth will have information about minority rights, cultural diversity and discrimination in the sessions and they will use this knowledge in their own following projects.
