

How to find a job/ an internship abroad?



Preparation

3. Start your research already some month before you will start the work

1. Make a point on your language skills- which countries are possible to work in?

2. Inform you about the country in books, on the internet, in the aliens department and through field reports by people who already went there.

4. Define your objectives

- Why do you want to go abroad for working/ doing an internship?
- What do you want to learn/ which skills can you bring to the company?
- Do you leave for a determined moment or do you want to emigrate forever?

📌 This can happen in every country, in every company. **Try to speak with your boss, maybe it is an error.**

You arrive the first day and you realize that the job doesn't exist or that the company doesn't need a new employee.

📌 To avoid that this case will happen to you, **ask to get the employment contract before starting the new job.**

1. The European Job Mobility Portal

- You click on « Search for a job »
- You will find a list of nearly every European country on the left
- For every country there are job offers in the language of the country.
- As active filters for the offers you have
 - All fields
 - Job title
 - Job destination
 - Employer's name
- You choose an offer that seems interesting for you. If the offer refers to you, you will find all the information needed for the application.



Method 1:

- You can search the jobs by giving a job title, keywords or the company's name.
- Then you choose the location where you want to go and click on « Find jobs »

Method 2:

- You choose one of the categories e.g. « Sale Jobs », « Engineering Jobs » or « Management Jobs » on the front page, there you will find directly all the job offers



Exemple:

1. You choose a category
2. You enter e.g. teacher in Germany
3. You will find all the offers in Germany

Method 1

1. Choose the country where you want to search a job
2. Choose a city in this country
3. Choose a job type

Method 2

→ When you have chosen a country, you will find different lists (*under chose a city*)

→ Search by Main Region

→ Search by City

→ Search by Job Type

As any job search:

- Determine the companies which refer to your project and your education.
- Define the content of the internship
- Make a point on your competences (the competences which could be interesting for the job) and your objectives
